## LENT-ASH WEDNESDAY



Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection and fasting which prepares us for Christ's resurrection at Easter.

Ashes are a sign that a fire has gone out. Sometimes we let the fire of goodness in ourselves go out. Lent is a time to turn back towards God

and change for the better so that the fire of goodness stays alive in us.
