The school fair was organised as our main learning focus for the term and it was a great experience for our children in seeing how a market type event is organised and run.


While our afternoon programme at school revolved largely with preparation for the fair we also spent time testing and carrying out observations to determine children's individual learning needs or priorities.

Once we had collated this information we then spend some time discussing the best approaches to meeting these learning needs within our classroom programmes and utilising the skills of the staff we have. In some cases we source outside advance if necessary.

One of the many advantages of our smaller school is that children can basically be running on individual learning programmes, particularly in Literacy (Reading, Writing). It also allows for very close one on one teaching where specific skills can be used to develop children's understanding. We are conscious of creating an environment through our learning programmes where children have the opportunity to use their talents across the wider curriculum and from this gain confidence within themselves which tends to carry over positively to all areas of their learning.
