

BOYS & GIRLS PLAYER REGISTRATION

PREMIER SECTION:
Recommended for players Year 7 or 8 at school (12-13 years old)
Played with a 142g red hard ball.

SECTION ONE:
Players should be 11-13 years of age or in Year 6, 7 or 8 at school.
Played with a 142g red hard ball.

SECTION TWO:
Players should be 10-11 years of age or in Year 5 or 6 at school.
Played with a 142g white hard ball.

SECTION THREE:
Players should generally be in their second or later season of cricket aged 9 or 10 years or in Year 5 or 6 at school.
Played with a 142g white hard ball.

SUPERSTAR CRICKET - SECTION FOUR:
Players should generally be in their second or later season of cricket aged 8 or 9 years or in Year 4 or 5 at school.
Played with a Mookaburra Soft Wonderball.

SUPERSTAR CRICKET - SECTION FIVE:
Section 5 is recommended for 7 year olds (players need to be able to bowl).

SUPERSTAR CRICKET ACADEMY:
Recommended for ages 5-6 years (cricketing 0-2 years)
Played with Soft ball and plastic bat.
