On Tuesday we were very lucky to have Kyle - Scarlet's dad demonstrate breadmaking and talk about the science involved. We learnt that the yeast transforms the sugar in the dough into carbon dioxide and the trapped carbon dioxide makes the dough rise. Kyle demonstrated a kneading technique involving 90° turns. In small groups we made our own loaves and the following morning Scarlet delivered the 5 baked loaves which we eagerly tasted and enjoyed.
