





Junior Room: Room 2 — Mrs Dillon (Whaea Dillon)


This week began our learning about the Holy Spirit. We discovered that God the Holy Spirit came to Jesus' disciples as wind and fire. We learned that although we cannot see it, we know that it is there. We can show the Holy Spirit working in us through our actions, words and deeds.



Middle Room: Room 1 — Mrs Hammer (Whaea Hammer)

This week we have looked closely at the story of the healing of the ten lepers - Luke 17:11-19.

We have then imagined we are one of the characters from the story - we could be Jesus, a leper or the leper that came back to say thank you. The children then wrote a prayer from the perspective of the character they chose.



Senior Room: Room 3 — Mrs Guthrie (Whaea Guthrie)

This week we began our learning about the Holy Spirit. Our first lesson was about the names or titles for the Holy Spirit. We used scripture to help us understand more about the role of the Spirit in the Holy Trinity. The children then used this knowledge to help them draw what the Holy Spirit might look like. Further learning about the Holy Spirit will include :The Holy Spirit as the bearer of grace, tapu holiness and mana power to all God's people., through Baptism the Holy Spirit brings people the grace to grow as children of God in the Church. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit helps people to believe in Jesus and grow more like him.



St Mary's Kaumatua.

On Tuesday this week the Kahui Ako formally welcomed Justin Hanning as our kaumatua at a staff gathering held at Kavanagh College. A kaumatua is a respected elder of either gender in the Māori community who has been involved with their whānau for a number of years. They are recognised for their capacity to teach and guide both current and future generations. Kaumatua have a good knowledge of Māori tikanga, language and history.

Justin will work across our schools ensuring that we are knowledgeable about our local environments and the stories that are linked to these areas.

Justin will also help us in a variety of ways for example:

- ensuring English into te reo translation is correct (eg signage)
- support with selecting an appropriate whakataukī
- speaking at a mihi whakatau
- supporting boards with understanding of te ao Māori
- helping make connections or suggestions for how we can build partnerships with our Maori families
- helping compile a local stories resource
