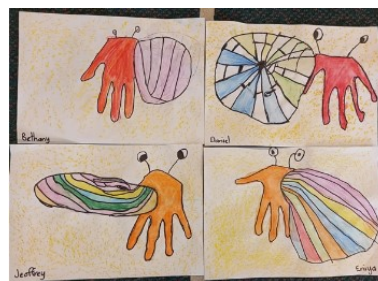

Junior Room: Room 2 — Mrs Dillon (Whaea Dillon)

We read the story "It's a Seashell Day" and found out that hermit crabs find new homes (shells) to live in as they grow. During art over the past week, the children created their own artworks and designed a shell for their hermit crab to live in. We looked at line and colour, traced around our hand to make the crab, drew a shell that was larger than the crab and had to make sure it overlapped our hand so that it looks like part of the crab is inside. This was quite tricky to do! We then used water colours, sharpies for outlining and used a rubbing technique with yellow crayon on the asphalt to make it look like the crab is on sand. The children did an amazing job!



Middle Room: Room 1 - Mrs Hammer (Whaea Hammer)

As part of our learning about Pentecost, we selected one part of the story we wanted to illustrate. We viewed a range of different art works about Pentecost. After deciding on a part, we used drawing pencils to sketch out our scene. Our next step was to go over our outlines with a black sharpie. This gave us clear outlines which we could colour using water colour pencils (changing in with pencils then using a small paint brush we could add water to our lines). As you will agree the final results look fantastic.

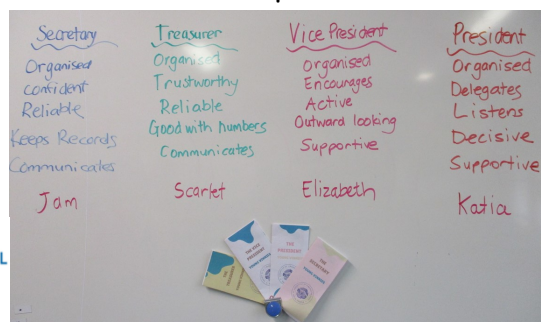


Senior Room: Room 3 — Mrs Guthrie (Whaea Guthrie)

Senior Room: Room 3 — Mrs Donnelly (Whaea Donnelly)

A bag of jet planes provided another maths activity. Equations were written using only the numbers 1, 3, 5, 8 and 20. We used brackets to show which parts of the equation were solved first. $(5 + 8) \times 3$ gives a different answer than $5 + (8 \times 3)$. Our next task will be to look at fractions and percentages e.g. 5 or $\frac{1}{4}$ of the jet planes are purple. 3 or 15% of the jet planes are pink.

$(5+8) \times 3 = 39$
 $5 + (8 \times 3) = 29$
 $(8 \times 5) + 3 + 1 = 47$
 $3 \times 5 + 3 + 1 = 58$
 $20 \div (3+1) = 5$
 $(3+1) \times 5 = 20$

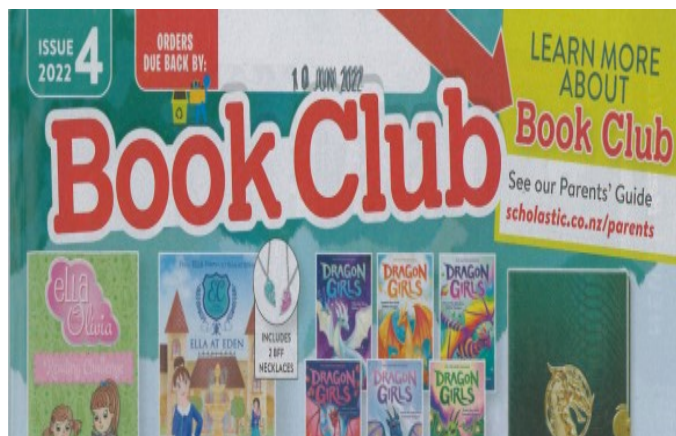
