Why did some priests wear pink last Sunday! Well technically, it is "rose". It was to tell every Catholic, "rejoice we are almost there" because we have 21 days left before Easter.

FACT : Rose vestments are worn only twice a liturgical year.

1. Gaudete/Joyful Sunday or the 3rd Sunday of Advent

2. Laetare/Rejoice Sunday or the 4th Sunday of Lent

Both Sundays are about joy in the middle of preparation for the 2 greatest celebrations of the Church, Christmas and Easter.



The Gospel Readings during the week are all from John's Gospel.

The gospel of John is quite different from the other gospels Matthew, Mark and Luke. Much of John's Gospel is unique to John and he does not share stories of Jesus' life in the same way as the other Gospels. For example it is only in John's Gospel that Jesus Gives Sight to a Man Born Blind (9:1-41), Jesus Raises Lazarus from the Dead (11:1-44), Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet (13:1-20).
