We cut out some irregular shapes to check if one side of the shape matched exactly the other side.

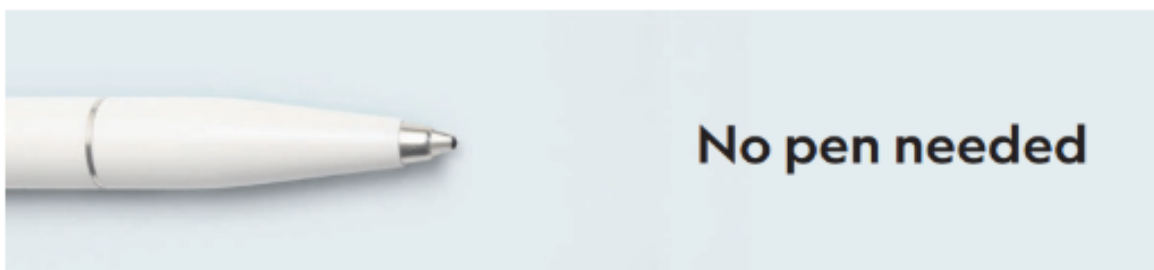
